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You can use a switch to share the connection, and it generally works fine. If you do encounter problems, we would recommend adding an additional NIC and dedicate one Enet port to the MHLINK connection.

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Are you on a Mac or a Hackintosh. By and large using a switch works fine (note: switch - not a router). The problem may be your NIC (if you are on a Hack).

I just ordered an ethernet->USB3 adapter to see if a second link would resolve the problem .
Otherwise I'll get a wifi dongle .

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Yeah -- it is probably your NIC, and not the switch/router.
You with the USB3 adapter, you will want to install the chipset driver (don't use Apple's driver).
If you have an open PCIe slot, we have found that the Intel i210 card works well (it will be lower CPU than a USB3 adapter)
